2024 IMPACT AT A GLANCE



Demonstrating its growing impact and community reach, ALH increased its membership by 20% from 2023 to 2024.

SURVEY RESULTS



90% reported satisfaction with the services they received from ALH.



82% of members reported increased ability to remain safely and independently in their homes due to ALH's support.



81% reported that their quality of life has improved with ALH's services.

THE BIG BASH - SPRING 2024

In 2024, more than 200 attendees joined ALH in person for The Big Bash, and at least 3,500 more participated virtually through social media and newsletter engagement. Thanks to its community,

ALH raised over \$100,000 at The Big Bash 2024, with funds directly supporting its vital mission, enabling more older neighbors to age well at home.



2024 FALL SERVICE SATURDAYS

From the county-specific Service Saturday events in the fall of 2024, ALH achieved:

Jefferson: 32 older adult homes served with the support of 70 volunteers.

Berthoud, Loveland, Johnstown: 25 older adult homes served with the support of 50 volunteers.

Denver, Aurora, Englewood, Centennial: 81 older adult homes served with the support of 1400 volunteers.

Fort Collins and Windsor: 21 older adult homes served with the support of 90 volunteers.

Grand Junction, Palisades, Fruita: 14 older adult homes served with the support of 40 volunteers.

BIG BASH OF BLUES - FALL 2024

ALH hosted its fall fundraiser event in Fort Collins for its older adult services programming in Larimer and Weld Counties, held on September 26, 2024 from 5-8pm at Avogadro's Number. The event featured blues music performed by Queen Bee and the Stingers and Grace Kuch, BBQ dinner, drinks, silent auction, and more.

- Medicaid


ALH hosted 15 organization-wide virtual events with 377 attendees.
