As the need for older adult services continues to rise across Colorado, A Little Help (ALH) is continuing to step up in big ways. In fact, 2023 brought in record numbers for older adult membership signups along with the highest rates of volunteer engagement across its service regions in Colorado.



81% of older adults reported that their quality of life has improved with ALH's services.

IMPACT STORIES

More than numbers, ALH believes that its impact is best shown through the stories and experiences of those served. Here are a few recent impact stories shared by ALH volunteers:

The night before an older adult member's birthday, one of ALH's volunteers installed a "Happy Birthday" yard sign on behalf of ALH. The next day, the volunteer followed up with a phone call full of birthday wishes, and the older adult member talked about the ripple caused by the sign, resulting in neighbors delivering birthday cakes and a birthday message written on a package by the UPS driver. She shared that so many of ALH's older adults just appreciate knowing that someone cares.

A volunteer shared when helped a member remove the cover from his air conditioner and was then repeatedly called by the member with multiple items "to fix." The volunteer quickly discovered that the member was taking apart items just so the volunteer would come and visit him because he was lonely and enjoyed spending time with him. ALH's amazing volunteer let him know that he doesn't need to break things for him to come visit, he's happy to stop by anytime!

A volunteer shared her experience taking a 97-year-old member to an eye appointment that lasted about three hours. The volunteer expressed that there was no way they were going to provide "uber" style transportation and waited with the member from beginning to end. The member couldn't stop expressing her heartfelt gratitude to her volunteer for providing such delightful companionship as she really misses her husband who passed away several years ago as well as their pet dog.

EVENTS & FUNDRAISING

THE BIG BASH 2023

ALH hosted its spring fundraiser event in April to celebrate its community impact and toast to the organization's recent accomplishments. The event brought together community members of all generations with delicious food, drinks, and a silent auction. ALH successfully raised \$65,000 to support its older adult services programming!

2023 SPRING SERVICE SATURDAY

ALH hosted its service launch for older adults located in Windsor, Johnstown, and Milliken in May of 2023. Volunteers helped with tasks around an older adult home such as raking leaves, planting, gardens maintenance, pulling weeds, washing windows, moving yard furniture into place for the season, seasonal cleaning & organizing, gutter cleaning and more! ALH successfully gathered 40+ volunteers to provide services for more than a dozen older adults.

LITTLE TALKS & VIRTUAL EVENTS

ALH hosted several Little Talks for older adults, with topics including:

- Ten Health Benefits Of Spring Cleaning
- Six Benefits Of The Great Outdoors
- Summer Self-Care in Colorado
- Improving & Maintaining Brain Health
- Fraud Prevention

ALH hosted 15 organization-wide virtual events with 200+ attendees.

PICKLEBALL, PINTS & PIES

ALH hosted a unique pickleball fundraising event in Northern Colorado, including a pickleball clinic, tournament, and party for an entire day event in Loveland. All skill levels were welcomed and encouraged to bring their families/friends to join in the fun. ALH gathered 50 older adults, family members, and pickleball players, many of whom were new to the organization, to support services and program throughout Northern Colorado.

2023 FALL SERVICE SATURDAYS

ALH hosted it's annual Service Saturdays in October! ALH achieved the following:

Metro Denver: 87 older adults served with the support of 227 volunteers

Jefferson County: 38 older adults served with

the support of 50 volunteers

Loveland and Berthoud: 38 older adults served with the support of **114 volunteers**

Fort Collins: 32 older adults served with the

support of 131 volunteers

Grand Junction: 11 older adults served with

the support of 21 volunteers

TECH COACH TRAININGS

ALH provided monthly sessions, in partnership with DOROT, to train volunteers for dealing with technology challenges with older adult members. Sessions presented how-to's on using technology with an older adult as well as going over useful tech guides. In 2023, ALH onboarded 12 new tech coaches and successfully fulfilled 112 tech help requests from older adult members. In total, 84 older adults received tech help at least once from a trained tech coach in 2023.



THE VILLAGE MOVEMENT



ALH began in 2005, when a group of neighbors joined together as Washington Park Cares to help older adults in their community age well at home. This model is based on the national **Village Movement**, which began as a grassroots experiment in Boston's Beacon Hill neighborhood over two decades ago. Susan McWhinney-Morse invited a group of neighbors to her home, encouraging them to put their heads together and figure out how to take control of their own futures so that they might remain rooted in their own neighborhoods and homes, rather than moving away as they aged.

In 2007, ALH was incorporated as a 501(c)(3) with the vision of neighbors connected across generations, creating strong communities and inspired by the **Village Movement** model. Since then, ALH's network has continuously innovated upon the model to help older adults thrive in their homes and communities across Colorado. While engaging community members of all ages, ALH prioritizes intergenerational activities and events into its programming. The organization also created Service Saturdays!(TM) to support older neighbors with seasonal yard and home chores by engaging the whole community. In 2023, ALH made significant strides in its service delivery through enhancing its database infrastructure with its software partner, Cividesk, and implementing hyper local weekly volunteer emails to prompt volunteers to pick up more urgent requests. ALH has also been preparing to build a mobile application to increase volunteer engagement, decrease manual staff processes, and better serve older adults, including in the rural areas across the state.

As the organization has learned and continued to expand its work, ALH's experiences are rippling throughout the **Village Movement**. Hilary Simmons, ALH's Executive Director, serves as Vice President of the Board of Directors of the Village to Village Network, the national nonprofit organization connecting villages and resources across the country. In this capacity, Hilary shares ALH's successes and challenges with peer organizations, helping them to reimagine the strength of the village model so that more older adults can thrive with the support of their neighbors and age well in place.


